Everyone who watched the show thoroughly enjoyed it!











Arrangements on the evening:

All children should arrive at the church hall at 6.15pm.

They must wear school uniform – but no sweatshirts please – as it will be too hot.

The concert should last about an hour. Please make arrangements for your child to be picked up after the concert.

Please can we kindly ask all parents not to bring young children as the concert is not suitable for young children to attend.

Admittance to the Carol Concert is by ticket only. These can be purchased via ParentPay at a cost of £3.50 each and are limited to 2 tickets per family. Anyone who arrives with additional family members who do not have a ticket will not be admitted into the Church and will be turned away. Extra children will not be permitted to sit on a parent's knee as there will simply will not be enough space.

Year Four Brass Lessons
