Working Together— Parental Workshops

e strongly believe that working with parents is so important in developing a strong partnership to help and support your child to achieve their best. This week we held our first phonics workshops for parents in Reception and we know from the feedback that parents really appreciated them.

Next Wednesday we will be holding a maths workshop for the parents of children in KS2. Once again we will run the workshop twice in order that we give as many parents the opportunity to attend. The first workshop will be held at 9:15am and repeated again at 6:30pm.

The workshop will share with you our approach to teaching maths, the importance of retrieval practice and the role that parents can play to support their children in their home learning. We will also look at the importance of mental mathematics and recall of number facts as well as helping you understand the expectations for your child whichever KS2 class they are in.

We really appreciate your support and by working together we can all support our children to be the best that they can be.

Handwriting

andwriting introduced in the National curriculum 2014, requires children to be able to produce 'fluent, legible and, eventually, speedy handwriting'

We teach handwriting regularly. In Year 2 children begin to learn continuous cursive writing (joined). Usually during KS2, children graduate to writing in ink once they've achieved a certain level of competence in writing with a pencil.

At Oakridge we acknowledge this milestone by giving children a certificate called a pen licence: a certificate that states that they are now allowed and expected to use ink for both their schoolwork and home learning. 'Pen licences formalise the transition from pencil to ink, and the prospect of earning a pen licence is used by teachers as a motivator to encourage children to develop the required standard of handwriting.

Teachers will usually assess children's work over a number of weeks to decide whether they're ready for a pen licence, rather than basing their decision on a one-off handwriting test. We share the steps to achieve a pen licence with the children through clear success criteria which we teach and facilitate at school.

With time and practice, most children will develop their own handwriting style that works in both pencil and pen. We feel it is important to share our pen licence success criteria with you so you can support your child at home.



Oakridge Pen Licence Criteria

- ⇒ Use an effective writing tool grip which results in **high quality presentation.**
- \Rightarrow Writing is always on the line with clear spacing (appropriate gaps between words).
- ⇒ All letters start in the correct place and are **formed correctly** relative to one another.
- ⇒ Letters are consistently the same size.
- ⇒ All ascending and descending strokes are the right length, angle and position on the line.
- \Rightarrow Letters are joined correctly.
- ⇒ Writing is clear and presented successfully for other people to read in all subjects.
