They responsible for the strategic direction of the school, working in partnership with the headteacher, promoting high standards of educational achievement and ensuring our resources are used to maximum impact. Governors individually have no power but when they act collectively, as a corporate body instead of as individuals, they are very powerful. Parent governors are a vital part of the school's governing board. They also help to ensure the board is connected with the parents at the school (although you are not expected to be a spokesperson for parents). In looking to fill this vacancy the governors have identified the following skills, experience and attributes that they feel would help strengthen the governing board:

- Finance
- ICT

All governors receive training to help them carry out their role. Staffordshire Governor Services runs a wide variety of training courses for governors which you can attend, including an induction course for new governors — we expect all our governors to complete induction training. Nominations must be from parents or carers with children at the school on the day that nominations close. Anyone standing for election must certify that they are not disqualified for any reason.

The meeting will be held at 9.15am and repeated at 6.30pm. It will last approximately 30 minutes.


Everyone is welcome to attend and we would particularly encourage parents who are new to the school in Year 3 and Year 4.

They discovered the special adaptations that these creatures have evolved, how they are classified, and what habitat they live in.
