#### **Parking around School**

e continue to receive complaints from concerned local residents regarding parking and driving around school.

- Parents driving on pavements and verges to overtake parked cars. I would add to this point that
  the cars weren't driving particularly slowly when on the pavement. This shocked and scared me
  since it is a dark morning and visibility isn't particularly good. I dread to think what could have
  happened if children were on the path at the time.
- Parents parking their cars on the single yellow lines on Silvester Way at the Overhill Road junction by the crossing lady. This not only made her job incredibly difficult but is very dangerous to park so close to the junction (hence the yellow lines are in place to try to stop this happening).
- Parents parking their cars on the single yellow lines at the Victoria Way/Silvester Way junction.

  This resulted in a bottle neck as cars could not turn into nor out of this junction.
- Parents stopping cars opposite parked cars on Silvester Way whilst children got out of the cars. The cars caused more bottle necks and as the cars drove off they had left their children on the opposite side of the road from the school. Thus the children had to cross the road on their own.
- Further bottlenecks were seen on Victoria Way as cars were parked along the road and this resulted in traffic having to overtake a number of parked cars to get passed. The oncoming traffic had to reverse which again resulted in cars mounting the pavement as children were walking by.

For the safety of all our children can we please ask that parents adhere to the parking and driving restrictions around the feeder roads into school during morning drop off and afternoon collection. Thank you.
