### **Reading for pleasure**

e ensure reading is celebrated as a highly regarded subject at Oakridge.

Our overall aim is for our pupils to read fluently and with understanding. We strive for pupils to understand the benefits of reading – as a crucial life-skill necessary for accessing and achieving academic success in all areas of the curriculum and beyond. We want our pupils leave Oakridge as confident, independent readers with a life-long passion to explore books for pleasure in order to be able to lead a culturally enlightened and fulfilled life.

We firmly believe that reading is the key to all learning and so the impact of our reading curriculum goes beyond the results of the statutory assessments. We give all children the opportunity to enter the magical worlds that books open up to them. We promote reading for pleasure as part of our reading curriculum and our children are encouraged to develop their own love of genres and authors and to review their books. This enhances a deep love of literature across a range of genres, cultures and styles.



Research shows that children who have never been <u>read to at home</u> are exposed to 4,662 words by the time they start school. If they are read 1 book per day at home this rises to 296,660 words and 1.5 million words if read multiple books per day.





Together we raised a fantastic, and much needed, £590!




