### A Message from the Co—Chairs

We are blessed with a highly skilled and committed team of Governors who have a simple mission and that is to work to improve the education of our children. School Governors are responsible for the strategic direction of their school, for holding the Leadership team to account, for overseeing the financial performance of the school.

The Full Governing Board meets three times a year, however e have 3 committees, which look at different aspects in more detail. Each committee meets up to five times a year and report directly to the Full Governing Board on their discussions and recommendations. There are 3 main committees, each with its own Chair:

Leadership and Management

Curriculum and Standards

Health and Safety

The chairs of these committees meet regularly to challenge and support one another.

We are all very proud and honoured to serve as Governors at Oakridge and we all take a strong interest in our school, providing both challenge and support to Mr Fisher, his senior leadership team and staff. We firmly believe that a key reason for the success of Oakridge is the excellent staff and leadership we have, who are all hardworking and dedicated to the excellent education of our children, ensuring they all receive a Disneyland curriculum that challenges them to reach for the stars every day.

As a Governing Board we always ask the question 'How are we better today than we were at our last inspection in 2014?'

- The school continues to be categorised as outstanding by the Local Authority
- We are delighted that the school continues to build upon its success with standards across the school remaining very high and the quality of teaching and learning continuing to improve.
- There is a clear curriculum intent statement which links directly to our school vision.
  The school curriculum is broad and ambitious. It is joined up and ensures clear progression with key 'sticky knowledge' planned for in each year group in each subject.
- Middle leaders have a very good knowledge of their subject.
- Enrichment activities continue to be well thought out and engage and enrich the children's educational experience. Even during these covid times there have still been over 40 enrichment activities for our children.
- The investment in professional development for all staff ensures that staff continue to grow and develop.

We firmly believe that a key reason for the success of Oakridge is the excellent staff and leadership we have, who are all hardworking and dedicated to the providing the highest standard of education for our children and ensuring they all receive a Disneyland curriculum that challenges them to reach for the stars every day. Even during lockdown we ensured that as full a curriculum as possible was delivered to our children and many examples from across the school have been shared with us at our meetings.

### Actions and achievements for the academic year 20 - 21

### **Health and Safety**

This year we have secured a further £52,000 grant to replace the school roof as well as secured funding to replace the hot water boilers within school. We have also replaced the Yr 5 windows, put new sinks in the reception classroom as well as ensured that the building is kept to a high standard. Further work planned includes:-

New car parking spaces for staff and visitors

Extending the playground area for KS1

Enhancing the KS2 playground markings

Painting classrooms and corridors

New carpet tiles for the school corridor and two classrooms

Turf area of the school field

The above work will be carried out during the summer holidays.

### **Policies**

Covid RA and action plan have ensured the school has remained open with high attendance.

All H and S policies have been reviewed and approved.

Safeguarding SCR check completed on three occasions.

### **Leadership and Management**

A further challenge facing us as Governors is the increased financial pressures put upon our school budget. The Leadership and Management Committee which has met on five occasions this year, ensuring that the resources that the school receives are used efficiently and effectively. The three year budgetary plan which has been developed ensures that the schools vision can continue to be delivered effectively with a focus on delivering the best possible outcomes for our children. This ensures that we are able to employ Mrs Holland to deliver high quality art and D and T and Mr Malkin to deliver high quality PE as well as providing our children with a wide range of sporting opportunities. We also ensure that as a school we invest in the best resources for our children ensuring that they add value to our children's learning. An example this year is our investment in 'maths no problem' which has built further upon our 'Singapore' approach to maths teaching.

Being one of the lowest funded schools in one of the lowest funded Local Authorities the schools results and the curriculum provision demonstrate excellent value for money. The best resource that we have at Oakridge is our staff, as they have the biggest influence upon children's learning.

Compared to the national average, Oakridge receives £940 less per pupil than the national average for all schools in England, which equates to over £200, 000 less in the school budget compared to many other schools across England. Compared to the national primary school average Oakridge receives £421 less which equates to over £103,000. This has been compounded even further with the impact of covid which has seen an £80 000 reduction in income from our wraparound care provision.

By running our own School Direct program to develop new teachers, as well as delivering a range of well-respected teacher training courses (NPQH, NPQML and SL), we have generated £30 000 additional income this year from the courses that we have delivered. With budgets being significantly cut, this externally generated income ensures that we can maintain staffing levels and provide our children with an outstanding education.

- The school continues to partner the Alliance of Leading Learning in delivering the NPQML and NPQH qualifications
- The continuing successful implementation of the Schools Direct programme.
- Continued support for the development of staff which has seen the school invest in the Visible Learning Program which has enhanced all staffs knowledge of leaning.
- All Policies reviewed and approved.
- Budget reviewed and approved, ensuring viability for next 3 years.
- Plan of action agreed given downturn in wraparound usage.
- Agreement to purchase dishwasher for kitchen.
- Effective use of Covid catch up funding (for example Maths no problem, PIRA and additional TA hours).

### **Curriculum and Standards**

Some of the schools achievements over the last year include:

- All policies have been reviewed and approved
- Remote learning policy has resulted in overwhelmingly positive feedback from parents re lockdown learning
- The full curriculum was delivered even during lockdown
- Yrs 1,2,3,4,5 have visited Laches Wood
- Y6 have been on a residential visit to Stanley Head
- Highest percentage take up of PE clubs in schools history
- Standards have remained consistently high
- The school has not stood still and subject leaders have all developed their subjects still further.
- The school vision of a 'Disneyland Curriculum' is continuing to being lived as can be seen by the number of enrichment activities that are provided to enhance the school curriculum even during lockdown.
- New RSE/ PSHE curriculum has been successfully implemented with voiced over power points provided for all parents.

### **Curriculum Intent:**

Our vision states that we believe in making our children world-class learners by providing a 'Disney Land' curriculum with a fantastic range of opportunities which engage, enrich and excite them as learners. Our curriculum therefore must provide the tools for children to be able to learn by allowing them to master basic skills such as reading, writing and understanding number. However our curriculum provides a purpose and relevance for learning, offering opportunities which instigate a love of learning, encouraging creative and critical thinking. High expectations and levels of challenge are present in all that we do, engendering an intrinsic sense of personal pride in achievement amongst our children.

Through our values, there is a focus on developing children's moral, spiritual, social and cultural understanding, as well as developing personal attributes such as resilience, empathy and honesty.

We aim to deliver a connected curriculum which ensures that children make progress throughout their learning journey, making links between areas of learning and ultimately between themselves and the world around them. We ensure that we explore concepts deeply and make every effort to give children the language and vocabulary to engage with learning, within the classroom and beyond. We enrich the curriculum with first-hand experiences such as trips, visits or speakers with the intention of providing knowledge and skills, as well as building aspirations for future life.

Through the learning experiences provided, we aim for our children to be able to think independently, appreciate the world around them and ultimately live happy and successful lives, making a positive contribution to their society, to be well prepared for life in modern Britain.



With restrictions in place we were still determined to deliver the curriculum to its fullest extent ensuring the delivery of our school vision.













We are delighted to announce that Oakridge Primary School has been awarded the 'Gold Standard Mark' for the fifth year running for our sport provision. The School Games Mark is a Government led awards scheme launched in 2012 to reward schools for their commitment to the development of competition across their school and into the community. Schools in England are assessed across bronze, silver and gold levels so to achieve the gold standard is an accolade that we are all very proud of. The Award rewards schools for their commitment to the development of competition across their school and in the community. Points are awarded for participation, engagement in sporting activity, entering competitive events as well as the leadership activities. We are also delighted that we have received the Sporting Virtual Award – for schools who:

- Have had pupils regularly entering School Games Virtual Competitions or
- Encouraged pupils to stay active at home while not in school

### Enrichment activities and educational visits 2020 - 2021

Each year we have between 60 and 70 enrichment activities in school. These help deliver our school vision by providing the children with a 'Disney Land curriculum with a fantastic range of curricular and extra curricular opportunities which engage enrich and excite them as learners.'





In 2020–2021, because of the lockdown, we were only able to hold 43 enrichment activities in school which have helped to make the children's learning real and give our children the 'cultural capital' that we believe is important. These are an integral part of our school curriculum and the support we have received from the vast majority of parents has been fantastic Once again, members of staff have given up their weekends and holidays to visit locations, before the trip takes place to ensure that the children's learning experience is maximized. the vast majority of parents has been fantastic.









### **Going forward**

Henry Morris, an educational visionary and one of the greatest figures in education of the twentieth century, once said that Schools are 'The training school for the art of living'. A statement that is still as important today as it was when Morris first said it in the 1920's. From September we will be introducing 'The Oakridge Way' at school. This will neatly set out what we want our children to be like, both in and out of school and continue to be like when they move onto High School.



The roots of the tree focus on how we want our children to be as people and the canopy focuses on the learning qualities that we develop in school. The 'Oakridge Way' will also be at the heart of our behaviour policy, with house points awarded to children for demonstrating how they are living 'The Oakridge Way' each day in school. We are also introducing 'positive notes' which staff will send home with children when they see a child is consistently displaying these values in school. These won't replace the Golden Book assemblies but will be another layer of positive reinforcement and a way that we can communicate these successes to you. We are all very excited about introducing this fully from September along with the new house system.

### Safeguarding our Children

It is everyone's duty to safeguard all our children. At Oakridge, Mr Fisher is the Designated Safeguarding Lead and Miss Homer and Mrs Evans are the Deputy Leads, however all staff and Governors are trained in safeguarding and receive annual updates.
