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Opportunities in Sport:

As part of our commitment to inclusion and equality in sport, Oakridge Primary School has taken deliberate steps to continue to ensure high-quality access to physical education and extra-curricular opportunities. This year, we have actively encouraged and supported girls' participation in a range of sports clubs and competitive inter-school events, as part of our Stafford Schools Sports Partnership. By funding all sporting extra-curricular activities and ensuring a welcoming, supportive environment, we have seen greater confidence and involvement from girls across the school, including success in inter-school competitions.

A key factor in this success at these competitive events has been the work of our dedicated sports coach whose presence has ensured continuity, high-quality training and strong team spirit. Lunchtime sporting provision, also delivered by our coach, gives children additional opportunities to stay active.

We also recognise the importance of valuing sporting achievement. This year we invested in new trophies and awards to celebrate effort, participation and success, making sure children see their contributions as meaningful. Furthermore, to broaden our PE offer and ensure high-quality teaching, we utilised a specialist dance coach to work alongside staff and inspire children to dance.

Furthermore, at the end of 2024-25 we were reaccredited with the **School Games Platinum Mark**, which is testament to the high importance we place on Physical education.
